Human Race - March 26, 2011

***** New Location *****

Wow! Time flies! It's almost been a year since we walked in the Human Race in 2010, but it's time again for this exciting event which is one of our biggest fundraisers! Again this year we are working towards purchasing a second van for our program (see the Van Challenge article).

This year's Human Race is scheduled for Saturday, March 26, 2011 at the **GREENSBORO COLISEUM COMPLEX**. We invite all our participants, their families, AGI staff, AGI Board members and all our supporters to join our team. The walking/running route will begin and end on Coliseum Boulevard. Besides walking or running, there is also free food, music, entertainers, t-shirts, and even free massages all taking place **INSIDE** the Pavilion! We have ordered blue skies and sunny weather for this spring event. Wouldn't it be great to have a "ginormous" crowd walking for AGI? Come join us. The first 1,000 participants who turn in \$50 will receive a free Human Race t-shirt.

Our goal for the Human Race is to raise a minimum of \$15,000. That would allow us to purchase our new van (see article below for more details).

The easiest way to do that – help us form teams to walk for After Gateway. Think about it this way – you could write us a check for \$50. That would be awesome. OR, you could form a team of 10 people who each raise \$50 for us. That's a total of \$500! We need a second van for our ever-growing participant population! Our first van is great, but it can only transport five participants in wheelchairs along with a driver and one caregiver – the other

caregivers must drive separately. We have outings for one group or another every day. Now because of our growth, sometimes we cannot transport an entire group in the van. So we desperately need a second van!

But good things are happening at AGI! We are getting closer to that big number we need to purchase a second van for our participants. Our target figure is \$60,000. With our fundraising efforts, pledges, and grants, we have secured \$45,000. *We only need \$15,000 to reach our goal!*

In 2010, Tech Triad chose After Gateway for a website “makeover” which was desperately needed. The goal was to make it “user friendly” to potential applicants while giving detailed information about the AGI program to families, case managers and community leaders, and listing resources for families with individuals with disabilities.

Dr. Sue Polinsky worked tirelessly with our administrators and board members to develop a superb product! The process was laborious and frustrating due to our very outdated equipment, scheduling conflicts and privacy constraints. To help with this, Tech Triad arranged for After Gateway to receive a \$5,000 grant from The Weaver Foundation for hardware and software upgrades.

Additionally, Simple Network Solutions (SNS) of Kernersville provided all the labor necessary to set up our new computers, including transferring data, and a back-up storage device.

Tech Triad received almost 40 nominations for the 2010 makeover. We are very appreciative that After Gateway was chosen for this honor. Tech Triad annually gives back to the community by helping non-profits develop community resources through their websites. Tech Triad is the oldest female-owned technology business in the Piedmont Triad region of North Carolina.

Thank you, Weaver Foundation for our much needed equipment upgrades, thank you SNS, and thank you, Tech Triad for making this possible!
